

Category	Definition
Arts & Creativity Literacy	The ability to understand art history, styles, techniques, and the ways to discuss art. Included within this concept is the ability to talk about the creative process as an artist. Similarly, the ability to impart holistic learning through creative expression and activities, as well as visualization and creative thinking.
Cultural Literacy	The ability to understand and appreciate the similarities and differences in the customs, values, and beliefs of one's own culture and the cultures of others.
Digital & Data Literacy	The ability to access, manage, understand, integrate, communicate, evaluate, and create information safely and appropriately through digital technologies for employment and entrepreneurship. Likewise, the ability to understand, explain, and document the utility and limitations of data by becoming a critical consumer of data, controlling a personal data trail, and finding meaning and taking action based on data. One can identify, collect, evaluate, analyze, interpret, present, and protect data.
Family Literacy	The ability to incorporate whole families into activities between parent and child, including training in parenting activities, literacy training that leads to economic self-sufficiency, and age-appropriate education to prepare children for success in school and life experiences.
Financial Literacy	The ability to develop knowledge, behaviors, systems, and teams, and plan to confidently take effective action that best fulfills an individual's personal, family, and global community goals.
Food Literacy	The ability to understand the impact of food choices on health, the environment, and the economy.
Health Literacy	The ability to find, understand, and use information and services to inform health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others.
Information & Media Literacy	The ability to seek, evaluate, use, and create information effectively to achieve personal, social, occupational, and educational goals. Additionally, having a framework to access, analyze, evaluate, create, and participate with messages in a variety of forms; having an understanding of the role of media in society, along with the essential skills of inquiry and self-expression.
Social & Emotional Literacy	The ability to "read," recognize, and respond appropriately to emotions and feelings in oneself and in others; likewise, learning how to build and maintain respectful relationships.
